

We have tried to make our information as comprehensive as possible but at the same time we have been very selective, in so much as the places we list are the places we think are worth your attention.



Strange asymmetric lecture theatre in dark grey brick; most powerful piece of modern architecture in London. Explore inside on Tuesdays; phone WEL 1174 for appointments.

**ST. PANCRAS STATION**  
Sympathise with the mass of ridiculous little towers on its roof, then go inside and look at the huge delicate iron work roof over the trains, and the iron work of the old gasworks it frames.

**THE MONUMENT**  
Monument tube station. London from above is pale, grey and gentle. Pay 6d and climb 311 steps.


